An attempt has been made to compile in Part II of the following bibliography as complete a list as possible of all works dealing with Anglican Orders from the English reformation to the present day, to serve as the basis for a complete history of the controversy, which has yet to be written. To assist the student, passages dealing with Anglican Orders in longer or more general works have been identified, where possible, by page numbers in parentheses following the place and date of publication. Although this list is certainly incomplete, it is by far the lengthiest yet compiled, as comparison with the bibliography in Fr Clark's *Anglican Orders and Defect of Intention* (the best and most complete bibliography of the subject up to that time) will show. Clark's list has been of great assistance in compiling Part II of the following bibliography, which includes all titles listed by Fr Clark.

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
